It also includes the benefits to those who are seeking to renew a relationship with God and grow deeper

in their spiritual walk.

In the NT we hear from Jesus talking to Simon Peter: Luke 5:4 New American Bible (Revised Edition)

4 After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch."

Jesus uses the full nets as a metaphor for the disciple's (including us) life purpose of spreading His message about the kingdom of God. I challenge each of us to share our personal experiences from our own walk

NEWS FROM THE BOARD MEETING ON FEBRUARY 12, 2024

 \perp Linda Kiraly presented a report to the board regarding the status of obtaining a 501(c)(3). The board has been trying for years to do this but has continuously run into problems. Linda has suggested we need to seek legal counsel in order to proceed. For those who don't know, a 501(c)(3) is an IRS designation for an incorporated organization whose primary purpose is charitable in nature. The board voted unanimously to proceed.

♣ The new Emmaus Music Books have been sent to the printer and are expected to be ready for the Walks. Thanks to Paul McKeever, Music Chair, former Music Chair, Brian Austin, and the committee who worked to put the book together. And thanks to the community for your Seed Agape offering to pay for the books. A total of \$263 was contributed, which covers the cost of printing and binding.

- ♣ Kitchen Training: Our Kitchen Coordinator Co-Chairs, Christen McConnaughhay and Kim Hutchins, have an important announcement to make in reference to volunteering in the kitchen during the walks. In the interest of safety concerns, especially during this current flu/Covid/RSV season, everyone working inside the kitchen where the food is prepared must go through a training session. All volunteers are appreciated and needed, but it is very important to know all the safety regulations when handling food. Christen is ServSafe certified, and she and Kim will be able to hold two training sessions before the walks. The dates are February 17 and February 24 at 9 am at Christen's restaurant, The Spud Stop, at 327 E Columbia Ave, Leesville right across the street from Shealy's BBQ. The sessions should last only about one hour and you must attend at least one. If you cannot make these sessions, you can still volunteer to work in the dining room area, but not in preparing food. You may contact Christen at 803-603-0317, or Kim at 803-231-8407 to sign up.
- ♣ Volunteers are needed to help set up the camp on Wednesday, March 6, beginning at 9 am. Many hands make light work, so please show up to help in any way you can.
- → The 72-Hour Prayer Vigil is up and running on the website. Go to midlandsemmaus.com and navigate to the Prayer Vigil site. Many slots remain empty and Wendy McLean, Prayer Vigil Chair, asks you to please sign up for both the Men's and Women's Walks for 30-minute time slots. Sign-up sheets will also be available at the next gathering.
- Lots of snacks (sweet, salty, healthy) are needed for the Snack Agape Table. Your donations will be appreciated by Mel Sansolo, Chair of Snack Agape, but most certainly by the pilgrims.
- → Table Agape is also an important part of each walk. Reunion Groups, please bring your Table Agape items on the night of Send-Off and leave at the Registration Table. Agape Chair, Terry Peterson, will have a box available in which to place your items.
- Levy Rogers, Luggage and Transportation, will need help in transporting the luggage to the dorm rooms during Registration, and then back to the area by the dining hall before Closing. Several people with strong backs are needed.
