## **COMMUNITY FOURTH DAY REFLECTIONS**

Hello. My name is Christen McConnaughhay, I live in Batesburg. I went on EOM Walk #51 where I sat at the Table of Martha, and I am looking for a new church home.

In your piety, study and action in the last week; was there anything that stood out to you?

Actually, yes. My son is struggling. I was reading my devotion Wednesday, and I read Deuteronomy 31:6 Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; He will never

leave you nor forsake you. It really struck me, it made me rethink, for myself and for him. It was a good reminder for us both. He's going through a divorce and also struggling with his faith. So, that really struck a nerve with me and I sent him a text message, and I put that scripture in it. I just reminded him that God's always there, no matter what we do, He's always there, and we need to learn to lean into Him.

I do my devotion every morning. My devotion leads me, starts me off and then I journal three or four times every week. I told my kids, "One day, when I'm long gone, you will sit down and read, and you will see where I've prayed for you continuously. Struggles that y'all faced, prayed for you to find the right mate, and prayed for you when you started talking about starting a family." Since becoming a Christian, every step of their life I've prayed for them.

At what moment in the past week did you feel closest to Christ?

We had to put our pup, Chloe, down. That was a struggle. In making that decision, that was when I felt Him the most. I had a sense of reassurance that I was making the right decision. Since then, a couple of times I questioned, "Did I make the right decision?" Then God steps in and He says, "You did what was right, She's better off now She's with me."

At what moment during this week did you feel you were responding to God's call to be a disciple?

Sharing the Word with my son. Just letting him know that God's always with him. A lot of times when we're at our highest highs we don't see Him, and when we're at lowest lows we turn to Him, but sometimes it takes us a little while to get there. He commented to me that he was waiting for that moment to know he was doing the right thing. And I explained to him that, sometimes we don't see that until we get to the other side. So, I'm just reminding him to be strong, and that He is strong and He is capable, and everything will be okay if he just continues to lean into God and listen to Him and let Him guide his path.

#### ANNUAL ELECTIONS

It's that time of year when we begin looking for five people to replace the five board members who have completed their terms on the Emmaus of the Midlands Board of

Directors. Nominations shall be solicited and/or accepted between July 1 and August 31. Each nominee, prior to consideration as a nominee, must sign a Statement of



Commitment form approved by the Board verifying his/her willingness to serve as an elected Director of the Board of Directors. In order to be eligible to serve as a Director, nominees must be an active member of the community and will agree to serve a three-year term. Ballots will be published the first business day in September and disseminated to the community. Completed ballots shall be accepted through October 15 according to instructions printed on the ballot. The names of the elected Directors shall be announced during the remainder of October to reach as many community members as possible. Elected Directors shall take office on November 1, 2025.

The Nominations/Election Committee will consist of the five (5) off-going Board Directors:
