I am Allison Thomson. I attend Red Bank Fellowship Church. I attended EOM Walk #17, and I sat at the table of Miriam.



In your Piety, Study and Action in the last week, was there anything that stood out to you?

A: My morning devotions, I listen to a lot of Joyce Meyer. The mind is where you win or lose everything that is going on. I think that is what I've learned the most recently. I was bad about letting my mind tell me how to act, how to respond, and it wasn't always good. And I like to sing. I have always said that that is me and God. That is my love letter to God. That's how we communicate-He puts songs in my head. I will say my weak point is daily prayer. He gives me little nudges, 'You aren't spending enough time with me.'

At what moment in the past week or so, did you feel closest to God?

A: I always feel close to Him because He always gives those nudges, that God wink. One that sticks out, though, is after the flooding in Texas. I was on my porch praying for those children. Just as plain as day He said to me, "I got them." I just bawled like a baby. John came out and said, "What's up with you?" And I told him I just couldn't stop crying. Just as plain as day. "I've got them. It's ok." And there is such a peace when He chooses to do stuff like that. It just blows me out of the water. That He knows our name. And He knows our heart. And He loves us enough to say, "I know your hurt. It's ok. I've got them."

Thank you for sharing, now we're both crying.....at what moment during this week did you feel you were responding to God's call to be a disciple, be the heartbeat of Christ?

A: Every day on my bus, is my opportunity to be the heartbeat of Christ. This little boy; definitely on the spectrum, he couldn't ride a regular bus. And at the school I drive for, if students don't play well with others, they'll put them on my bus. His second day, I was talking to him. He pointed to my ring-it had a cross on it-and said, "Are you Jesus?" And it just slayed me. I said, 'No, but I know him. Do you know who Jesus is?' From that day on, it was like a connection with him. He was always ready for a hug. It was a testament to what he needed. He lived with his grandmother; he had been taken from his mother; he was seven or eight. Living it and loving those kids. I mean, the old cliché, you're the first smiling face they see, and probably the last they see that day. And that is important. That's the biggest way I can live it with these kids. It's just loving them.
